Board Member since 2001

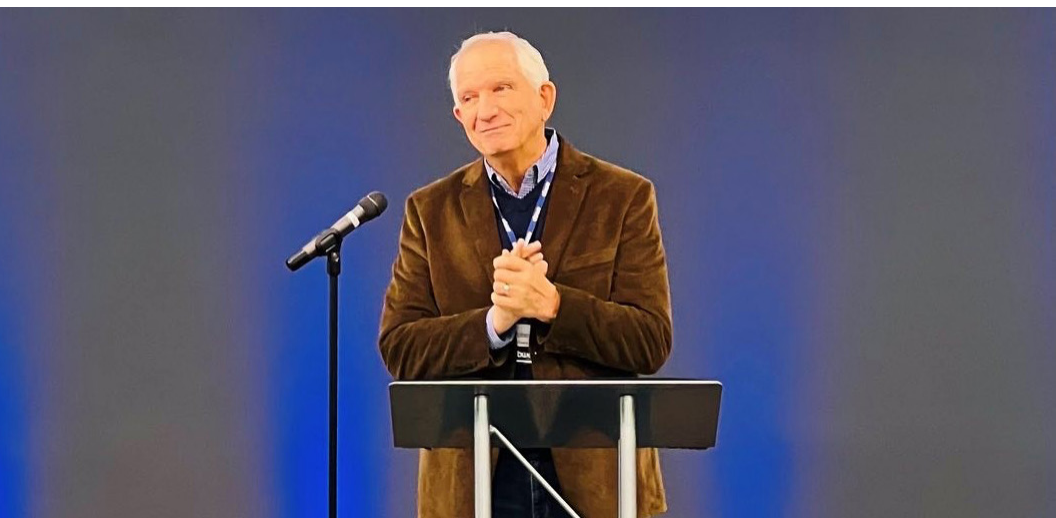
