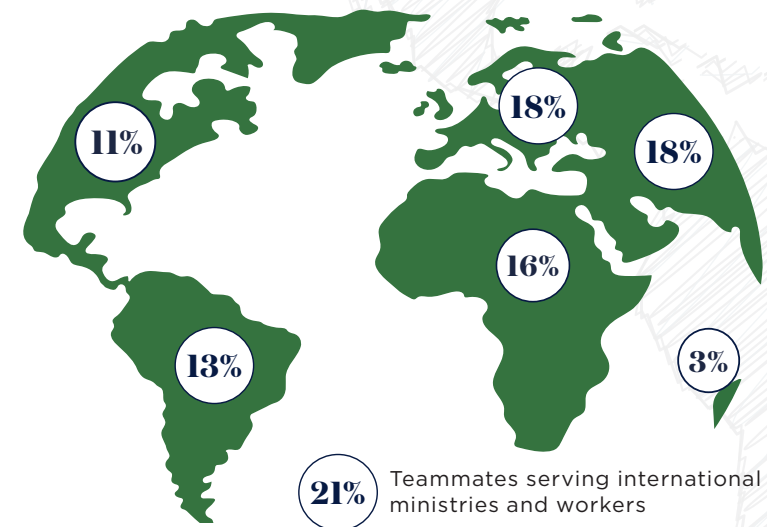
2022 Global Ministry Report

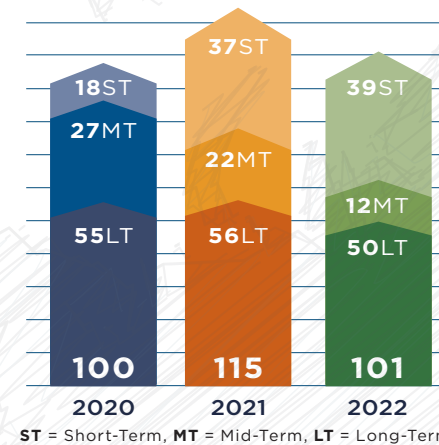

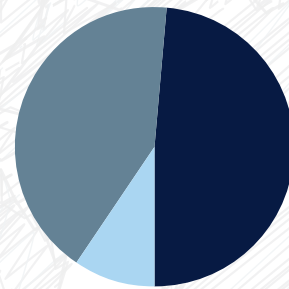

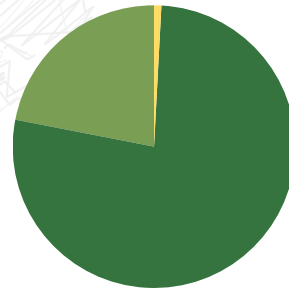
WHO SUPPORTS ABWE?

UKRAINE CRISIS FUND

National partners and churches throughout Eastern Europe are receiving physical aid to help them in outreach to Ukrainian refugees, and locals are noticing. One ministry partner remarked that refugees are saying that "no one treats them like Christians do, and they feel God's love to them."
